 - Review the <u>college catalog</u>, familiarize yourself with your intended program of study, and identify potential courses for enrollment.
 - Access Navigate to schedule an appointment with your academic advisor.
 - Send any/all appropriate documents (ex. unofficial transcripts, AP or IB scores, CLEP, etc.) to the advisor's email address at least 24 hours prior to your scheduled appointment.
 - Ensure you have proper access to technology to participate in virtual advising appointments (i.e., zoom, internet, etc.)
